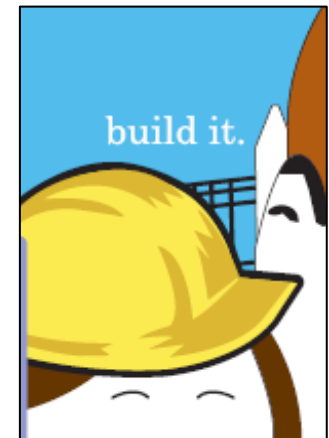
Checkout – Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>
